



**ENGLISH ACCENT:** Two designers collaborated on this English-style library-den, intended for relaxing as well as for conducting business at home. Ed Singer, of Interior Concepts by Ed Singer Inc. in Hollis Hills, New York, said his goal was to unite existing architectural elements with new mahogany millwork in the 20-by-24-foot room in Englewood Cliffs. Singer proportioned the room's features for orderly focal points and "comfortable formality." For instance, his ceiling grid visually reduces the room's 14-foot height.
